 - Murphy Police Dept is having a flag raising on March 14th at their new station.
 - Mountain Lakes Board of Realtors received a grant for \$7,499 for the community garden at Hiwassee Dam Fire Dept.
 - Commissioners received an email this week announcing a grant for ADA upgrades to the Rock Gym thanks to Senator Corbin. The grant award is \$170,000.
 - Congratulated Hiwassee Dam VFD on its recent reduction in ISO rating from a 5 to a 4.

- Chairman Phillips commented on the recent election results and said that he is not going to sit idle for the next eight months, that he will continue working for the county through the end of his term. He said he appreciated the support he has received over these last few years and said he has made many friends during that time.
- Motion made by Commissioner Griggs and seconded by Commissioner Adams to add discussion of a strategic plan to the March 19th work session. Motion passed unanimously.

County Manager Items

The county manager congratulated Commissioner Adams on completing the Advanced Leadership Course at the School of Government and said he appreciated Ben taking the time to go through the program.

Motion made by Commissioner Griggs and seconded by Commissioner Stiles to add a transportation agreement as item "d2" under New Business. Motion passed unanimously.

Adoption of Agenda

Motion made by Commissioner Stiles and seconded by Commissioner Adams to adopt the agenda, as modified Motion passed unanimously.

Budget and Finance

Motion made by Commissioner Stiles and seconded by Commissioner Adams to approve a budget revision in the amount of \$9,962 for use of insurance proceeds from a totaled patrol car to uplift a 2023 Dodge Durango patrol vehicle. Motion passed unanimously.

Motion made by Commissioner Adams and seconded by Commissioner Griggs to approve a budget revision in the amount of \$17,900 for Cherokee County Schools request to use Article 40/42 sales tax to replace shower tile at Andrews High School. Motion passed unanimously,

Motion made by Commissioner Adams and seconded by Commissioner Griggs to approve a budget

revision in the amount of \$300,000 for a Dogwood Health Trust Grant for Community Paramedicine Program planning. Motion passed unanimously.

Note: There is no county match. \$100,000 will be used to assist with developing a plan for a community paramedicine program and \$200,000 will be used for EMS recruitment and training of personnel.

AMENDED TO CLARIFY PURPOSE OF APPROVED FUNDS: Motion made by Commissioner Griggs to approve a request from Peachtree Volunteer Fire Department for Rescue Funds in the amount of \$31,432.05 to purchase rescue equipment. After discussion, Commissioner Griggs amended her Motion to approve a budget revision in the amount of \$20,000 for the purchase of the three major rescue items; airbag kits, rescue hammer and concrete saw. Motion seconded by Commissioner Eichenbaum. Motion passed unanimously.

Motion made by Commissioner Adams and seconded by Commissioner Eichenbaum to approve an electronic bill payment software for the Tax Collection office in the amount of \$2,640, contingent upon the software being vetted through Cherokee County Information Technology department, Motion passed unanimously.

Motion made by Commissioner Griggs and seconded by Commissioner Adams to approve the FY 2022 amended audit contract. The amendment is a date change only, requested by the audit firm, with a date to the Local Government Commission now being April 2024. Motion passed unanimously.

New Business

Motion made by Commissioner Adams and seconded by Commissioner Griggs to appoint Karissa Van Ostrand to the Cherokee County Needs and Solutions Advisory Committee. Motion passed unanimously.

Motion made by Commissioner Adams and seconded by Commissioner Stiles to appoint Sandra Daley to the Cherokee County Board of Equalization and Review. Motion passed unanimously.

After discussion and presentation by Airport Manager Chris Williams and Veteran Services Officer Danna Pash, a Motion was made by Commissioner Griggs and seconded by Commissioner Adams to approve the date of October 12th for the 2024 Welcome Home Veterans Event at Western Carolina Regional Airport, contingent upon the Welcome Home Event committee providing proof of special event insurance. Motion passed unanimously. The event is aviation-related and does not require FAA approval.

Jennifer West, Cherokee County Transit Director, came before the Board to present a transportation agreement for Valley View Care and Rehabilitation. The agreement would be for the remainder of this fiscal year and would provide transportation for clients of Valley View to their respective destinations. After discussion, a Motion was made by Commissioner Adams and seconded by Commissioner Griggs to approve the agreement, as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

Jennifer West, Cherokee County Transit Director, came before the Board to present a transportation agreement for Murphy Rehabilitation, Inc. The agreement would be for the remainder of this fiscal year and would provide transportation for clients of Murphy Rehabilitation, Inc. After discussion, a Motion was made by Commissioner Adams and seconded by Commissioner Griggs to approve the agreement, as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

Motion made by Commissioner Adams and seconded by Commissioner Griggs to table discussion of the proposed Voluntary Agriculture District Ordinance. Commissioner Adams said he had some questions he would like to ask before moving forward. Motion passed unanimously.

Sheriff Smith and Captain David Williams came before the Board to present a proclamation recognizing first responders. Annual Opioid Settlement Funds Planning Discussion and Updates

Russ Harris of Southwestern Commission updated the Board on the regional planning meetings that have been taking place over the last year and shared counties local priorities. The Town of

Murphy and the Town of Andrews was invited to attend and discuss opioid settlement funding strategies with the Board of Commissioners.

Public Comment Period

Captain David Williams advocated for higher pay for sheriff's office personnel.

Oscar Valdez asked permission to place an archway at the entrance of Konehete Veterans Park. Mr. Valdez said that he would be paying for the archway. Mr. Valdez said the archway would be 20' wide and about 13' high. Before considering the request, the Board asked Mr. Valdez to come back with schematics/drawings of the project.

Budget and Finance

- Motion made by Commissioner Adams to table until the Board has had its budget hearings. The county manager explained that the reason they are being requested now is to get them ordered, so they will be here by the new budget year. After discussion, a Motion was made by Commissioner Phillips and seconded by Commissioner Eichenbaum to approve a budget revision for use of fund balance in the amount of \$71,800.00 to order two vehicles on state contract form Capital Ford, Inc. of Raleigh to replace a 911 Addressing Office vehicle and a Tax Assessor Office vehicle. Voting in favor of the Motion was Commissioner Phillips, Eichenbaum, Griggs and Stiles. Voting against the Motion was Commissioner Adams. Motion passed 4-1. Note: Purchasing through the State contract saves the county \$8,200.00. The 911 Addressing office vehicle being replaced is a 2008 Chevrolet Colorado with 99,247 miles, and the Tax office vehicle being replaced is a 2008 Chevrolet Colorado with 151,538 miles.
- Motion made by Commissioner Eichenbaum and seconded by Commissioner Adams to approve a budget revision for Cherokee County Schools request for use of Article 40/42 sales tax funds in the amount of \$36,057 for Murphy Elementary School gym floor offices and Murphy High School commercial athletic washer. Motion passed unanimously.
- Sheriff Smith requested funding in the amount of \$75,361.00 to purchase for his use, a 2024 Expedition and for upfitting the vehicle. After discussion, a Motion was made by Commissioner Eichenbaum and seconded by Commissioner Phillips to approve the purchase of a 2024 Ford Explorer for Sheriff Smith's use in the amount of \$42,350.00. Note: The county can purchase the Explorer through state contract. Total savings by purchasing an Explorer, instead of Expedition is \$30,000.
- The County Manager presented the fiscal year 2025 recommended budget with the following highlights:
- No increase to the property tax millage rate of 61 cents
- No increase in fees except the requested changes to GIS Mapping service fees
- \$2,928,572 addition to designated General Fund Balance for payment #3 due on July 15, 2025 of the DSS suit settlement
- A use of designated fund balance and the corresponding expense budget for payment #2 of the DSS suit settlement payment due on July 15, 2024 in the amount of \$2,928,572

- A use of Article 46 Designated Fund Balance for Cherokee County Board of Education operations in the amount of \$730,573 and for Tri-County Community College capital request items in the amount of \$244,745
- 2% Cost of Living Adjustment
- \$400,912 appropriated as Contingency to address unexpected needs or opportunities
- An increase in the Local Governmental Employees' Retirement System (LGERS) contribution rate of 12.93% to 13.67% for general employees and \$14.04% to 15.04% for law enforcement officers. This resulted in an increase in retirement expense of approximately \$105,000.
- \$104,000 increase in insurance & bonding
- \$943,832 use of General Fund Balance for major capital needs
 - o Annex Building elevator replacement \$125,000
 - o Articulating Dump Truck for solid waste \$254,000
 - o Frazier ambulance remounts (2 units) \$523,540
 - o North Tac Repeater site backup \$15,000
 - o 911 Emergency Communications Critical Spare Equipment \$26,292

New Business

Michael Starks, member of Hiwassee Dam VFD, came before the Board to request approval of a tax-exempt loan certification and written agreement resolution. Motion made by Commissioner Adams and seconded by Commissioner Griggs to approve. Motion passed unanimously.

Note: Cherokee County is not a party to the loan, but because the County contracts with the Department and provides a fire tax, the Board of Commissioners must approve the bank's resolution.

Motion made by Commissioner Stiles and seconded by Commissioner Griggs to approve a 12-month lease between Titan Fuel and Cherokee County/Western Carolina Regional Airport for the lease of a jet fuel truck. Motion passed unanimously.

Local Emergency Shelter Grant Program Application

After discussion, a Motion was made by Commissioner Griggs and seconded by Commissioner Eichenbaum to approve the application of a Local Emergency Shelter Grant. Motion passed unanimously. The grant, if awarded, is 100% reimbursable, and would be used to purchase and install a generator and/or a transfer switch for a generator at Unaka Community Center, purchase and install a generator at a location TBD in the Hiwassee Dam Community, and to purchase and install a generator at the Andrews Community Center.

After discussion, a Motion was made by Commissioner Adams and seconded by Commissioner Stiles to approve an amendment to the Board of Equalization and Review resolution to allow for unpaid volunteer members. Motion passed unanimously.

Motion made by Commissioner Stiles and seconded by Commissioner Griggs to approve the tax releases, tax refunds, and NCVTS report, as submitted. Motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Eichenbaum said he reached out to Cherokee County Cooperative Extension Director Doug Clement for assistance. Commissioner Eichenbaum read Mr. Clements comments and suggestions, which included, determining what the county's long-term goal is for the facility and potential grant funding sources. While in closed session, the Board heard from Architect Jeff Sherer, of Architecture Unlimited, who presented information to the Board and County management regarding development projects. The presentation and discussion contained proprietary design work and work product that impact a competitive bid process. Likewise, it presented information that would impact the security of one or more public buildings now existing or that may exist in the future. The presentation involved a proposed building to house County facilities, including Cherokee County Senior Services and Cherokee County Veterans Assistance office on Hilton Street in Murphy at the site where the Cherokee County Health Department is currently situated. The Health Department will remain in operation at that location, until such time as funding is available for construction of a new health facility. Design choices and competitive bidding instructions were discussed. The Board gave direction to County Management to discontinue the renovation project at the National Guard Armory site and to execute the movement of Emergency Management, Emergency Medical Services, and 911 Addressing to 911 Andrews Road as soon as possible. Needed renovation work and the establishment of an Emergency Operations Center in that facility ago to be taken from available grant funding only, at this time. Also discussed, was the impact the scope of the projects would have on other county services. After hearing information from the architect the County Manager, and the County Finance Officer the Board returned to open session and voted as follows:

- 1. Motion made by Commissioner Eichenbaum and seconded by Commissioner Phillips to undesignate \$105,653.00 that had been designated for Armory renovation and add funds back to fund balance. Motion passed unanimously.
- 2. Motion made by Commissioner Adams and seconded by Commissioner Griggs to proceed with construction of an addition to EMS Station 2 in Andrews and to engage Architecture Unlimited for design of the addition and renovation to the existing Station 2 facility. Motion passed unanimously. Note: Addition and renovation was approved to cut the cost of the project, while providing for new living quarters for on-duty EMS personnel and use of the existing facility to house vehicles and storage.
- 3. Motion made by Commissioner Adams and seconded by Commissioner Griggs to instruct Architecture Unlimited and County Administration to prepare detailed plans and bidding processes for a Type 3, three-story structure to be located on Hilton Street in Murphy to house Senior Services, VA, Environmental Health, Cherokee County Transit and other county offices. Within the Motion, the Board instructed for a primary bidding for the first 2 floors to be finished

and for the 3rd floor to be unfinished to accommodate future growth. The alternate bid would be for finishing all 3 floors. Motion passed unanimously.

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When did the original quit working and need to be replaced?

It froze during the rolling black outs during Dec 2022. When the rolling black outs occurred and the power turned off to the unit, the freeze protection devices quit working because there was no electricity to work the heat tape and the unit froze and busted in the heat exchanger.

Latest update is that the unit could possibly be installed in Oct 2024, after cooling season, still subject to change.

When was the rental initiated?

March / April 2023 when we needed AC for the building

When did the rental blow up?

April 15, 2024

What caused the current rental to blow up?

When our maintenance team was winterizing the unit as requested by the vendor due to the vendor not having staff available to send to us for them to do this shut down, the maintenance team unhooked the chiller, drained all the water, replaced with antifreeze until it ran out the feed pipes, then hooked hoses together to keep anything from infiltrating the heat exchanger, per directions from Carrier's technicians. When our maintenance team came to restart the unit in the spring, it had pressurized with freon and blew apart pipes with the pressure explosion putting two of our maintenance men at urgent care with minor injuries (thankfully). The rental company maintains that we let the unit freeze and bust, however we maintain there had to have been a small leak in the heat exchanger thus compromising the unit itself that would not have been due to our improper care. We believe this because the unit would not run due to low oil readings most of the summer and we were already making multiple trips to reset the unit prior to this issue but we were limited on our options for rentals due to such a high demand - which is also why we kept and winterized the unit so that we would have it available again when needed. The unit was fixed at one point by Carrier by adding oil to the compressors - the only way it could have been low of oil was due to leaking in the heat exchanger into the water where it could not be detected because oil and freon are mixed internally in the compressor system.

Will insurance pay for the 2nd rental?

We had taken the additional insurance on the rental, but there is some discrepancy between CCS and the vendor on the above described winterization. We intend to make a claim on either the secondary insurance or include it as part of our claim to our property insurance.

Whereas, Cherokee County administration is responsible for executing the budgetary decisions made by the Board of County Commissioners and for ensuring compliance with the North Carolina Local Government Budget and Fiscal Control Act, State statutes and federal regulations, as well as stewardship of already-budgeted taxpayer dollars.

Whereas, proper notice and vetting of funding requests outside of the established county budget are necessary from time to time.

Whereas, the Cherokee County Board of County Commissioners requires information regarding the nature, scope, possible alternatives, and availability of funds to consider supplemental budgetary requests.

WHEREFORE, The Cherokee County Board of Commissioners, hereby, implements, adopts, and ordains the following regarding supplemental budgetary requests from all county departments and other agencies requesting funding from Cherokee County:

Supplemental funding is any and all funding outside of, or in addition to, the Cherokee County Budget Ordinance for the fiscal year in which the request is made. Any requesting individual, department, municipality or other agency requesting funding from the County shall submit the following no less than ten (10) calendar days before the matter is requested to be brought before the County Commission:

- 1. A document detailing:
 - -the request and the need for the requested item or service
 - -signature of the person or agency/department head making the request.
 - -supporting documentation such as cost estimates, quotes, etc.
 - -delivery dates of requested items or services
 - -efforts made to secure alternative funding (grants, other governmental bodies, etc.)

RESOLUTION BY THE COUNTY OF CHEROKEE AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF OPIOID SETTLEMENTS AND APPROVING THE SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR ADDITIONAL FUNDS

- WHEREAS, the opioid overdose epidemic has taken the lives of more than 37,000 North Carolinians since 2000; and
- WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has compounded the opioid overdose crisis, increasing levels of drug misuse, addiction, and overdose death; and
- WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates the total economic burden of prescription opioid misuse alone in the United States is \$78.5 billion a year, including the costs of healthcare, lost productivity, addiction treatment, and criminal justice involvement; and
- WHEREAS, certain counties and municipalities in North Carolina joined with thousands of local governments across the country to file lawsuits against opioid manufacturers, pharmaceutical distribution companies, and chain drug stores to hold those companies accountable for their misconduct; and
- WHEREAS, a settlement has been reached in litigation against the Kroger Co. ("Kroger") as well as its subsidiaries, affiliates, officers, and directors named in the Kroger Settlement; and
- WHEREAS, representatives of local North Carolina governments, the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners, and the North Carolina Department of Justice have negotiated and prepared a Second Supplemental Agreement for Additional Funds (SAAF-2) to provide for the equitable distribution of the proceeds of these settlements; and
- WHEREAS, by joining the settlements and approving the SAAF-2, the state and local governments maximize North Carolina's share of opioid settlement funds to ensure the needed resources reach communities, as quickly, effectively, and directly as possible; and
- WHEREAS, it is advantageous to all North Carolinians for local governments, including Cherokee County and its residents, to sign onto the settlements and SAAF-2 and demonstrate solidarity in response to the opioid overdose crisis, and to maximize the share of opioid settlement funds received both in the state and this county to help abate the harm; and
- WHEREAS, the SAAF-2 directs substantial resources over multiple years to local governments on the front lines of the opioid overdose epidemic while ensuring that these resources are used in an effective way to address the crisis;
- **NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Board of Commissioners of Cherokee County hereby authorizes the County Manager to execute all documents necessary to enter into opioid settlement agreements with Kroger, to execute the SAAF-2, and to provide such documents to Rubris, the Implementation Administrator.
