

Cherokee County's Most Popular Trout Waters

- 1 Shuler Creek**
Hatchery Supported from Joe Brown Highway (SR 1326) bridge to Tennessee state line and Wild Trout Water on game land portions. Several pull-offs along Shulers Creek Road (SR 1322) and Burrell Mountain Road (SR 1325). Avoid posted lands.
- 2 North Shoal Creek**
Wild Trout Natural Bait Waters on game land portions. Access via Cedar Cliff Lane (US Forest Service Road #408) from Burrell Mountain Road.
- 3 Copper Creek**
Undesignated Trout Water. Access Copper Creek Road (SR 1333). Avoid posted lands.
- 4 Bell Creek, Garrett Creek, and Cook Creek**
Wild Trout Water on game land portions, and Undesignated Trout Water on private land. Access via Bell Creek Road (SR 1335) and Greasy Creek Road (SR 1336). Avoid posted lands.

- 5 Tellico River, Peckerwood Creek, and Tipton Creek**
Wild Trout Waters on game land. Access via Davis Creek Road (SR 1337) Forest Service Road #420.
- 6 Beaverdam Creek**
Wild Trout Water on game land portions, and Undesignated Trout Water on private land. Access via Beaverdam Road (SR 1331). Avoid posted lands.
- 7 Little Creek**
Wild Trout Water on game land portions, and Undesignated Trout Water on private land. Access via US Forest Service Road #420B from Davis Creek Road (SR 1337). Avoid posted lands.
- 8 Dockery Creek and Bald Creek**
Wild Trout Natural Bait Waters on game land portions and Undesignated Trout Water on private land. Access via Davis Creek Road (SR 1337). Avoid posted lands.

- 9 Davis Creek**
Hatchery Supported from the confluence of Bald and Dockery Creeks to Hanging Dog Creek. Access via Davis Creek Road (SR 1337). Avoid posted land.
- 10 Hanging Dog Creek**
Undesignated Trout Water. Access via Boiling Springs Road (SR 1338), Ebenezer Road (SR 1345), Hanging Dog Road (SR 1331), and Ed Graves Road (SR 1342). Avoid tribal and posted lands.
- 11 Owl Creek**
Undesignated Trout Water on private lands and Wild Trout Water on game lands. Access at various points on Owl creek Road (SR 1340), Hanging Dog Road (SR 1331), and Ebenezer Road (SR 1345). Avoid posted lands.

- 12 Hyatt Creek**
Hatchery Supported Trout Water. Access along Hyatt Creek Road (SR 1379). Avoid posted land.
- 13 Webb Creek**
Wild Trout Water on game land portions, and Undesignated Trout Water on private land. Access via Webb Creek Road (SR 1384). Avoid tribal and posted lands.
- 14 Junaluska Creek**
Hatchery Supported from Ashtum Creek to Valley River. Access along Junaluska Road (SR 1505). Avoid posted land.
- 15 Valley River**
Hatchery Supported from its headwaters to U.S. 19 (Business) bridge in Murphy. Access along U.S. 19 and Business 19 at various points, Fairview Road (SR 1515), Airport Road (SR 1428), Wells Road. Avoid posted land.

- 16 Hiwassee River**
Undesignated Trout Water. Access at bridge crossings with U.S. 64 and along Alternate U.S. 64. Call TVA at Chatuge Dam and call Duke Power for times of river generation for safety. Avoid posted lands.
- 17 Nottely River**
Undesignated Trout Water. Access at bridge crossings with Highway 60, U.S. 64, Raper Road (SR 1598), Cook Bridge Road (SR 1596). Avoid posted lands.
- 18 Persimmon Creek**
Undesignated Trout Water on private lands and Wild Trout Water on game lands. Access at various points on U.S. 64 (West), Sunny Point Road (SR 1130), Bell Hill Road (SR 1127), and Highway 294. Avoid posted lands.
- 19 South Shoal Creek**
Undesignated Trout Water on private lands and Wild Trout Water on game lands. Access at various points on Candy Mountain Road (SR 1150), Shoal Creek Road SR 1145), and Hiwassee Dam Access Road (SR 1314). Avoid posted lands.

Effective August 1, 2010



Undesignated Trout Water

*All waters on game lands are Public Mountain Trout Waters and are classified as Wild Trout Waters, unless classified and posted otherwise.

When anglers encounter "posted against trespass" signs along designated sections of streams on private lands, they should respect the property owner's rights and choose another location along that stream to fish. The establishment of open fishing seasons does not obligate a private land owner to allow access to his property, nor does it eliminate the ethical requirement for obtaining permission from the landowner before entering his property. Inclusion of a stream on this map does not indicate that all or part of the stream is open to public fishing. Always obtain permission for non-public, undesignated waters from property owners.
